# HISTORY: Introduction to the Archaic Period and Old Kingdom of Egypt

Time Needed: 55 minutes

## **Objective:**

By the end of this lesson, students will be able to:

- 1. Understand the key features and events of the Archaic Period (Early Dynastic Period) and Old Kingdom in Egypt.
- 2. Identify the importance of the Pharaohs and their role in Egyptian society.
- 3. Recognize significant cultural and technological achievements during these periods.
- 4. Analyze the connections between the geography of Egypt and the development of its civilization.

#### **Materials Needed:**

- Whiteboard/markers or notebook/pen
- Projector or Digital Device
- Week 4 Slides
- A short video (optional) on ancient Egyptian history

# **Lesson Outline:**

#### 1. Drill/Review (10 minutes)

- Ask student(s) drill questions from the unit they just completed using the P2Rs and Scavenger Hunt questions. Focus on the following aspects of Mesopotamia:
  - Geography
  - o Political development
  - o Culture
  - Religion

#### 2. Introduction (5 minutes)

- Warm-up Question: Ask student(s) what they know about Egypt. What comes to mind when they think of ancient Egypt? (Encourage responses like pyramids, pharaohs, mummies, etc.)
- **Introduce the Topic:** Write the terms "Archaic Period" and "Old Kingdom" on the board or in a notebook. Explain that these were some of the earliest periods in the history of ancient Egypt, setting the foundation for one of the world's most fascinating civilizations.
- **Objective:** Briefly state that today we will explore the beginning of ancient Egypt, focusing on the formation of Egypt as a unified kingdom and the advancements during the Old Kingdom.

#### 3. Direct Instruction (20 minutes)

### • The Archaic Period (Early Dynastic Period):

- o **Timeframe:** Roughly 3100 BCE to 2686 BCE
- o **Unification of Egypt:** Discuss how the two regions of Upper and Lower Egypt were unified under the first pharaoh, Narmer (or Menes). Show a map of Egypt and point out the significance of the Nile River in connecting these regions.
- o **Key Events:** Narmer's role in unification, the founding of the first dynasty, and the development of writing (hieroglyphics) and monumental architecture.
- o **Pharaoh as a Divine King:** Discuss the concept of the Pharaoh as a living god, and how his role was seen as a unifier and a protector of Egypt.
- o **Ma'at:** Explain the concept of Ma'at (cosmic order), which was the balance the pharaoh was expected to maintain.

#### • The Old Kingdom (2686 BCE - 2181 BCE):

- o **Timeframe:** Discuss the peak of Egypt's power and stability during the Old Kingdom.
- o **Construction of Pyramids:** Emphasize the construction of the famous pyramids, particularly the Great Pyramid of Giza. Discuss the role of the pharaoh in commissioning these grand structures as tombs for themselves.
- o **Pharaohs of the Old Kingdom:** Mention famous pharaohs like Djoser (who built the Step Pyramid) and Khufu (who built the Great Pyramid).
- Society and Government: Explain how Egypt was a theocracy where the pharaoh held both religious and political power, and how this system influenced their government and society.
- Technological and Cultural Achievements: Discuss advancements like pyramid construction techniques, the development of a more complex writing system (hieroglyphics), and the flourishing of art and architecture.

#### 4. Video (Optional) (5 minutes)

• Show a short video on the unification of Egypt and the Great Pyramid of Giza to provide a visual and more engaging explanation of the material discussed.

#### 5. Activity (10 minutes)

#### T-Chart: Comparing Mesopotamia to Egypt

- Have students work individually or in small groups
- o Have them create a T-chart with Mesopotamia on the left and Egypt on the right.
- o The student(s) should brainstorm and list in the left column what they remember about Mesopotamia's geography, political development, culture, and religion.
- o In the right column, students should list corresponding differences/similarities learned about Egypt today.

#### 6. Discussion and Review (10 minutes)

- **Discussion:** Have the student(s) present the highlights from the T-chart they created.
- **Points to Emphasize:** Review key terms and concepts from the lesson. Reiterate the significance of the Archaic Period in unifying Egypt and the Old Kingdom's achievements.
