

BIBLE: Cain & Abel / Noah and the Flood / Tower of Babel

1. Review Chapter 3: The Fall (10 minutes)

- Ask questions from the Review Worksheets and Chapter Quiz

2. Bible History (10 minutes)

Scripture: Genesis 3-4, 6-11

Resource: *BSBS*: Read “From Bad to Worse” and “Rain, Rain, Go Away”

Main Points:

- **Genesis 3-4** (Cain & Abel) - People made a big mistake by not listening to God, and that brought sin and trouble into the world. Disobeying God leads to problems, but God still cares about people.
- **Genesis 6-9** (Noah) - God sent a big flood to clean the world because people were doing so many bad things, but He saved Noah and his family because Noah obeyed Him. God cares about right and wrong, He protects those who obey Him, and He keeps His promises.
- **Genesis 10-11** (Tower of Babel) - People spread out across the world and how God stopped them from building a tower because they were being too proud. God wants people to follow Him, not just try to make themselves look important.

Discussion Questions:

- Why do you think God liked Abel’s offering better?
- What should Cain have done instead of getting angry?
- Would you trust God and build a boat with no rain in sight?
- What happens when we try to do things our way instead of God’s way?

Key Points:

- **Cain & Abel** – God sees our hearts. He wants us to give our best and treat others with love.
- **Noah** – Obey even when it’s hard to understand.
- **Babel** – Pride and disobedience lead to confusion.

3. Memory Verse (5 minutes)

Genesis 11:9a (ESV)

"Therefore its name was called Babel, because there the Lord confused the language of all the earth. And from there the Lord dispersed them over the face of all the earth."

Song: Seeds Kids Worship – “Babel” (*I Am with You* album)

Connection to the Story:

- God used language to stop wrong plans and help people follow His better plan.
- We should listen to God and not try to do big things just to make ourselves look great.

4. Closing Prayer (2 minutes)
