Historians Still Wonder

The Great Pyramid of Giza is one of the most impressive structures in the world. It is the

only one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World that is still standing today. It was constructed

as a tomb for the Pharaoh Khufu over 4,500 years ago and originally stood 481 feet tall. The

pyramid covers ten football fields, and some of the limestone blocks, which were used to build the

pyramid, weigh 2.5 tons. Historians believe workers dragged the blocks up temporary ramps to put

them in place because they were so heavy. The pyramid was brilliantly designed and aligns almost

perfectly with the four cardinal directions. The pyramid contains several chambers, and one of them

is the King's Chamber that once held Khufu's body. Millions of visitors travel to see the Great

Pyramid of Giza every year. Historians still wonder how ancient Egyptians built such an impressive

structure with simple tools.
